Well Update



Asante Sana! Thank you for your incredible generosity that enabled us to move forward with building out the well. Above you see photos of the pump-house foundation being laid and the finished building. You can see the wellhead (red) at the center of the photo of the pump-house foundation. The water storage tanks have been purchased but can't be installed until we build fencing with reflectors to deter any wandering elephants coming out of the Ngorogoro! The national electric company, TANESCO, is installing

poles to extend the electricity to our site. The pump will be installed soon and after various operational tests, will begin to provide needed water to the families of the Tloma region.

There is an often-used phrase in Swahili that anyone who has been there has learned to appreciate: “Pole pole” (pronounced ‘polay polay’). It means “go slowly” – sometimes used to mean “be careful” when you’re climbing out of a safari jeep, for example. When it comes to a major project like this well, pole pole is both a blessing and a curse! We want the project finished NOW and the water distributed ASAP! But that is not the rhythm or timing with which things happen in Tanzania. At each step we are ensuring that all the proper local permits and approvals are in place, and are working with the community to ensure that residents of the village will be able to maintain and operate the well for the long term. Everything is on track and progressing well; just not at the same speed that it would here in the States. We’ll keep you updated...

Education Updates

Work on the well has nearly consumed our small 6-member volunteer team, but our central focus has always been on education. Water is key to health, nutrition, and will help provide funds to support education in the long-term. But right now, we have 180 children preparing to take national exams to finish primary school, and 58 secondary school students we’ve sponsored waiting to hear if they will be able to continue their education next year. We’re celebrating a generous donation of \$2025 that just arrived and one new student sponsorship for four years of boarding school. A donor has agreed to match all gifts up to \$5000 – that means double the impact!

We are so thankful for this generosity, but the need continues to be great. Below are some of the students who are still waiting to hear if they will get the assistance they need to continue their education. Will you help us send one or two more students to the local secondary school for just \$135 a year? The boarding school, which provides a much better education, is only \$450 per year. For a brief description of these bright young people, please read on...



This serious young man is Brian Faustino Mkude who ranks #1 in his seventh grade class of 180 pupils! Not only is he amazingly bright, he is also polite, and has big dreams for a 13 year old: He plans to be a doctor. For this he needs to attend one of the best Science and Technology (STEM) boarding schools in the Tloma Region. However, his family doesn't have the means to pay the \$1700 per year for tuition, room and board and supplies. How can we let his potential go to waste? Together we can get Brian the funds he needs to help make a difference in the lives of people in the Tloma Region. Will you help us support Brian's dream?



These two orphans need our help! Asha and Ibrahim have overcome incredible odds in their young lives. Both have the potential to make great contributions in the future – but need financial help to continue on to secondary school. On the left, is 13-year-old Asha Majuto, whose parents died a few years ago. She lives with her brother and works hard at school, especially in her favorite subjects of Math, English and Social Studies. She ranks #6 in her class of 180 pupils. She wants to become a lawyer so she can help other

people. On the right is 14-year-old Ibrahim Yotam, whose parents died when he was young. He lives with his grandfather and studies hard, ranking #8 in a class of 180 pupils. His goal is to become a teacher to help future generations be successful through education.



Meet Saidati Awadhi, she is 12 years old and also ranks 6th in her class of 180 pupils. She wants to become a nurse someday so that she can help keep her community healthy. She excels at English, Science and Math, which will help her achieve her dream. But she can't get there without financial assistance to continue her education. Her mother is a widow and is not able to pay for secondary school. It takes only \$450 to send Saidati to boarding school. Will you help her achieve her dreams and make a difference in the health of the community?.
